Dear Brentwood Borough Families,

March 17, 2020

As you are aware, on Friday, March 13, 2020, Governor Wolf closed all K-12 schools in Pennsylvania for two weeks. This means that no direct instructional activities are to take place, and our students are not to be accountable for any work related to their courses. What was not clear in Governor Wolf's communication was if the days will have to be made up; Governor Wolf stated that districts may apply for a waiver if they do not meet the state requirements for time and days of instruction. What confused many educators about this communication is that on the waiver form, it clearly states that schools must attempt to get the 180 days in before June 30, 2020 prior to a waiver being filed. We are currently seeking clarification on this from the Governor's office.

We know and understand that closing schools has a tremendous impact on our students and families. We received information today from the Allegheny County Health Department (ACHD) that all nonessential businesses in Allegheny County are being asked to close. Furthermore, President Trump stated that gatherings of people should be limited to ten people or less. With directives becoming more restrictive, school districts are grappling with how to update families with minimal staff.

The administrative team has gathered educational, social, and mental health resources for families to utilize during this time. If families are unable to access the online resources listed below, please contact your child(ren)'s school during the hours of 10:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. A building administrator will assist you in obtaining hard copy materials, if the closure extends beyond March 27, 2020.
